The Daimler and Lanchester Owners Club is making a feature in the outdoor VIP classic car park. Of the assorted Daimlers is last year's 'Highly Commended' Conquest Roadster, along with SP250, V8 saloons, a Daimler Majestic Major, and Daimler 15 sports saloons.

A major draw will be the 1939 Daimler Dolphin. This was Daimler's entry in the 1939 Monte Carlo and Scottish rallies, and the only saloon version of this model.



The other dozen produced had dual cowl touring coach work, of which several were destroyed at the factory during the blitz. This 2.5 litre competition car is owned by Fred Williams of Bristol.

The convoy will assemble at Dobbies Garden World in Shepton Mallet on Sunday morning, and then make the three-mile drive to the show ground at midday.
